Patient Programs and Services

The American Cancer Society provided answers, care and support to cancer patients and their caregivers when and where they need it. our free programs and services provide up-to-date information, day-to-day help, like transportation and patient lodging, and emotional support. For cancer information and support, visit cancer.org or call 1.800.227.2345 day or night.

Saving Lives in Hawaii 2015

- Our trained Cancer Information specialists offer information, answers and support through our 24/7 toll-free information line at our National Cancer Information Center (NCIC).
 2,776 individuals from the state received patient related information through NCIC and other channels of customer service.
- Our statewide network of volunteer drivers provided 111 cancer patients more than 838 rides to cancer-related treatments and appointments through our Road To Recovery program. Additionally, we offered 428 patients vendor transportation assistance when no volunteers were available.
- We provided lodging to 36 cancer patients and their caregivers while they traveled away from home for treatment. These guests received 164 nights through our Hotel Partners Program.
- 1,260 Hawaii patients received a free Personal Health Management Kit (PHMK) to guide them through their cancer journey. PHMK's help patients keep track of appointments, medication, test results, insurance, and bills.
- 105 newly-diagnosed breast cancer patients received one-on-one support from a survivor through the American Cancer Society Reach To Recovery program.
- ACS CAN: We made tremendous strides in advocacy through ACS CAN. In 2015, staff & volunteers supported successful campaigns to raise the age for tobacco to 21, making Hawaii the first state to take such bold action in tobacco control. Additionally, ACS CAN worked on legislation to ensure that health insurance drug formularies are more transparent and accessible for patients to determine their out of pocket costs.

Build Hope. Save Lives.

When the American Cancer Society's Clarence T.C. Ching Hope Lodge Hawaii opens its doors, it will offer free, temporary housing for cancer patients who are undergoing outpatient treatment and their caregivers a place to stay when their best hope for effective treatment is in Honolulu. Hope Lodge will ese some of the financial and emotional burden associated with travel, and allow the patient to focus on what is important: recovery. The facility will provide up to 7,300 free housing nights yearly for an estimated 487 patients receiving active cancer treatment in Honolulu, saving Hawaii Pacific cancer patients up to \$1.38 million annually in lodging and transportation expenses. Our Hope Lodge will be open to patients in November 2016.
